

EntreCivil – Entrepreneurial Skills for Establishing Civil Society Support Networks



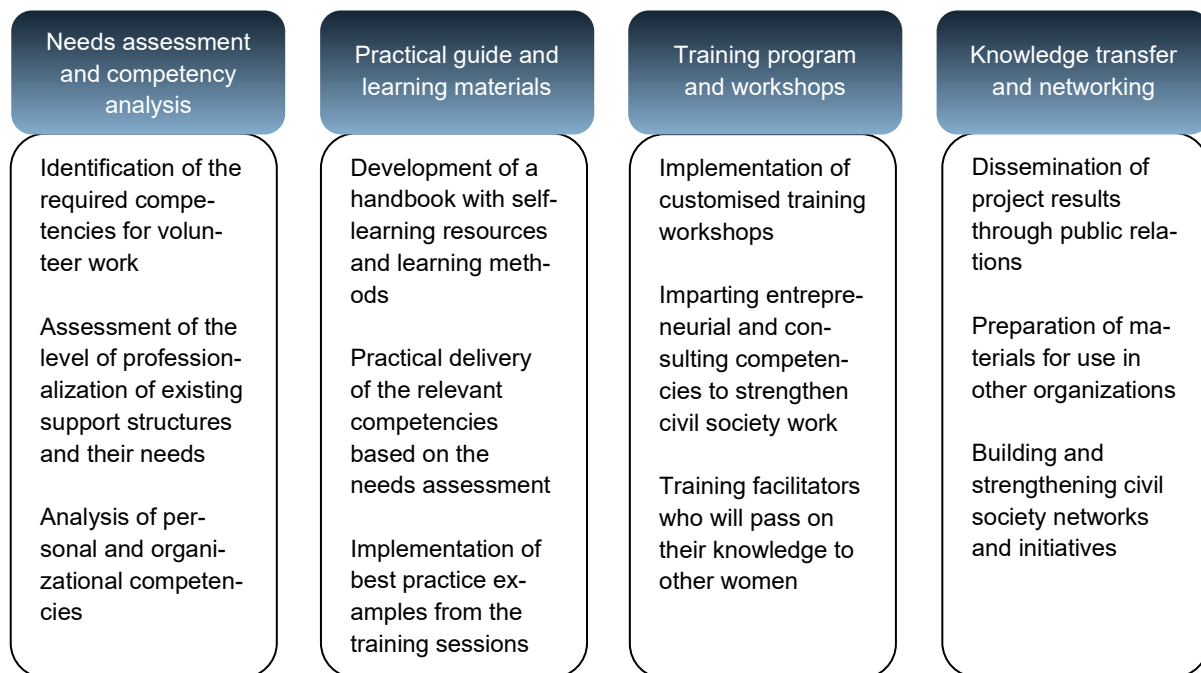
Focus on Refugee Women from Ukraine

The war in Ukraine has led to a massive refugee movement, with the majority of refugees being women. Many of them are involved in civil society initiatives that support other refugees – for example, helping with housing searches or integration into the labour market. This voluntary work requires a variety of skills: organizational, social, and entrepreneurial competencies. However, there is often a lack of necessary resources and skills to carry out this engagement in a long-term and professional manner.

The project targets Ukrainian women in Austria, Germany, Liechtenstein, and Switzerland who are active in refugee assistance or wish to establish initiatives.

The goal of the project, is to empower these women through targeted training. They will acquire entrepreneurial skills that will help them better organize and sustain their work in civil society refugee support. This will ensure the long-term sustainability of their engagement and strengthen self-help efforts.
